Mr. Jeff Zurek, OMS Math teacher, shared how he is utilizing Google Classroom to streamline assignments for his students. Mr. Zurek has prerecorded his lessons using QuickTime and created a YouTube channel to store the video lessons. Students are able to access the day-by-day video lessons when they are absent or just need a lesson reiterated.

8.9. Superintendent Report

- Kiley Kastrup, Math Instructor at Otte Middle School (OMS), presented information on MAP testing results for math growth at OMS. Factors that contributed to the outstanding math growth:
 - OMS transitioned to a 77-minute block (M-Th) and 60-minute block (F) for the 2020-21 school year (up from 42-minute block).
 - In 2019: 124.6 hours of math instruction for the 2018-19 school year.
 - In 2021: 2018.8 hours of math instruction for the 2020-21 school year.
 - Smaller class sizes due to CDC recommended guidelines.
 - Having 8 core sections.
 - \circ Implementation of intervention programs into the classes.
 - Remote strategies used all year long.

• Leon Haith, Director of Student Services and Otte Middle School Assistant Principal, shared an updated number of anticipated preschool students for the 2021-22. The need for early childhood special education services continues to rise in Blair and the addition of two (2) preschool classrooms are necessary, making it a total of five (5) preschool classrooms for the 2021-22 school year. Rule 11 guidance through NDE, requires the district to have a regular education student match for every special education student (1:1) in each classroom and no more than 20 students in a room.
